
USHS LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP HANDBOOK 2024



This booklet lists current scholarships and general selection criteria established by those individuals and organizations who established or are involved in granting these scholarships and awards. Awards will be presented at the annual Scholarship Dinner in June.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID OVERVIEW

Student Financial Aid is defined as any money awarded to students to help them fund their college or, in some cases, vocational education. Financial aid comes in many forms, but fall into two categories:

- 1. Gift Aid- Grants & Scholarships
- 2.**Self-Help Aid-** Loans (borrowed money needed to be paid back) or work-study (requiring students work at a college to assist with financial need)

*This handbook focuses on gift aid and will guide you through applying for local scholarships.

GRANTS

Grants are awarded on the basis of financial need as determined by applications such as the FAFSA and the NYS Tuition Assistance Program Application. These applications will take into consideration family income and size of household when calculating the "Expected Family Contribution".

Federal Government=FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)=Pell Grants

NYS Government= TAP (Tuition Assistance Program) Grant

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are monetary awards given on the basis of academic success, leadership, volunteering, and athletics. Scholarships do not have to be repaid.

SOURCES OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

COLLEGES

Students are often notified by the college if they are eligible for a scholarship upon being accepted or receiving their financial aid package letter. Students should also use the college website to research scholarships that may require an application.

• BUSINESSES/COMPANIES, CHURCHES, UNIONS, ETC.

These scholarships are usually available to the children of employees or members. Each student should have his or her parent/guardian check with the union steward, company personnel officer, local credit union, secretary, minister, etc. to find out what is available.

CORPORATIONS

Coca-Cola, Walmart, McDonalds, Dell, Microsoft, etc.

CREDIT UNIONS

Many credit unions offer scholarships for students who have bank accounts through their credit union.

NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

For example: FFA, 4H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution), Knights of Columbus, etc.

LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Local scholarships at Union Springs are primarily for one year only, but do provide some financial aid.

APPLYING TO SCHOLARSHIPS

Steps for applying to local scholarships:

- 1.Go to <u>www.unionspringscsd.org</u>, select High School and go to the links section at the bottom of the page.
- 2. Select Xello from the list of links.
- 3. Click on "College Planning" under "Quick Links" on the right side of the page.
- 4. Click on "Local Scholarships" then click on "Search for Local Scholarships".
- 5. Click on a scholarship to learn more about criteria and to access the application.
- 6. Applications can be printed in the library.
- 7. Complete all sections of the application and submit to the high school office by the due date.
- 8. Scholarships are listed as "NOT A LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP" and "LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP". NOT LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS are regional so be sure to read the instructions carefully, especially regarding the submission process and due dates.
- 9. Please come to the high school office if you have any questions.

(All transcripts, report cards, letters of recommendation, and reference forms will be attached to local scholarship applications in the counseling office.)

HELFUL HINTS & ADVICE

- 1. Be sure to read all scholarship information and applications. You may be eligible to apply for a scholarship you didn't think you would be eligible for.
- 2. PAY ATTENTION TO DUE DATES! All applications are due to their committees before or on a specific date.
- 3. Scholarships with a "Varies" due date have not been received by the counseling office prior to printing this handbook or have multiple scholarships available that are due on different dates. Check Xello regularly for new scholarship opportunities!
- 4. Please be sure you are going to apply for a scholarship prior to requesting a recommendation letter or reference from a teacher. Please be considerate of the teacher's time. Recommendations and references are very time consuming.
- 5. The counseling office can mail any non-local scholarship applications. Please use the "Materials Request" form in the counseling office to request an official transcript and other information. Local scholarships are noted in Xello and have "Union Springs High School Office" as their primary contact.
- 6. When in doubt, ask! We are here to help, so if you have any questions, stop in the high school office.
- 7. Write thank you notes to all your benefactors and recommenders. Be sure your note is legible. They really appreciate hearing from you!

SELECTION/NOTIFICATION PROCESS

- Once applications are received <u>on time</u>, they are delivered to the designated scholarship donor/selection committee.
- The committee notifies the counseling office once a recipients are chosen.
- The counseling office mails an invitation to parents/guardians inviting them to the annual scholarship dinner. (June 4, 2024)
- All students receiving a dinner invitation will receive at least one award.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

Banker Bill Scholarship

Bill Ryan, affectionately known as Banker Bill, was a lifelong resident of Union Springs, and a graduate of the USCS Class of 1959. The school and the village were near and dear to his heart. He was employed by Cayuga Lake National Bank for over 58 years, 43 of them as the President, CEO, and Chairman of the Board. He loved this community and never forgot where he came from. He always felt that it was his job to help people. When he passed away, it was only fitting that we would carry on his memory and all that he stood for by creating this scholarship.

<u>Cayuga Fire Department Ladies Division Scholarship</u>

The Cayuga Fire Department Ladies Division Scholarship has been established to assist students of Union Springs Central School in furthering their education beyond high school. The sole obligation of the recipient of this award is to have the serious intention of completing his/her education in the field of his or her choice. Scholarship awards will be made by a Scholarship Selection Committee composed of three members of the Cayuga Fire Department and Ladies Auxiliary. Selection will be based on the application form, school records, and recommendations. Criteria to be considered by the committee will be the applicant's personal qualifications, expressed goals, professional promise, financial need, and scholastic achievement.

Union Springs Hall of Fame Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by the Union Springs Hall of Fame Committee to honor student athletes of Union Springs High School, and to assist them in their future endeavors. To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants should be a senior athlete who has played at least one varsity sport during their high school career, with a minimum of two years of participation in a varsity sport.

Members of the Hall of Fame Scholarship Committee will review the applications and recommendations to determine a male or female recipient. Selection will be based on the individual's athletic achievements, sportsmanship, work ethic, motivation and character. Winners will be recognized at the annual Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and at the Senior Scholarship Dinner.
