EMERGENCY & SCHOOL CLOSING INFO:

Occasionally, the Superintendent may decide it is in the best interest of the health and safety of the students and faculty to either cancel/delay school or send students home early. This could be due to weather, but it could also be due to extraneous circumstances such as a water main break.

Note: Please remember to keep up-to-date contact information on file so that you can be reached in case of an emergency.

It is important to note that sometimes only one school may be affected by a cancellation, delay or early release, and emergency plans should be set in place for students (especially elementary students). Please instruct your children about what they need to do if school is canceled, delayed or dismissed early.

Emergency Bus Passes will be utilized for early dismissals to transport students to authorized sites. Only custodial parents or legal guardians can authorize changes in these transportation arrangements, so please maintain current information at your child's school.

In the event of an emergency closing during the school day, high school students will be bussed to their regular drop-off location unless a High School Emergency Closing form is completed and submitted to the high school office noting an alternative drop-off location.

Note: Emergency provisions cannot depend upon older children who may remain in school.

Notice of school cancellations and delays will be broadcast on local radio and television stations, sent out through SchoolMessenger, and posted on the district's website, unionspringscsd.org.

To sign up for notifications through SchoolMessenger, simply text the word YES to 68453.

Note: Text rates and data charges may apply. The district will not send more than three messages per month, unless weather conditions or emergency announcements are necessary. To opt-out at any time, text the word STOP to 68453.

EMERGENCY RELEASE DRILL:

The district's emergency plans include procedures for sheltering, early release, and evacuation of students. A district-wide Emergency Release Drill is scheduled as part of the disaster and civil defense plan required by all school districts. Parents should make sure their children know what to do during this drill and in all such emergencies.

We ask that parents not change the emergency plans they have on file in school for this particular drill so that it will be a true test of the system.

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ATTENDANCE:

Regular attendance at school is extremely important to a child's educational progress. Punctuality is another good habit that is necessary. We urge parents to help their children develop these good habits by sending them to school on time and by keeping them home only when illness or a serious emergency arises.

The only legal excuses for absences or tardiness allowed under the NYS Education Law are:

- Sickness
- Sickness or death in family (3 days max.)
- Doctor appointments
- Impassable roads or weather making travel unsafe
- Religious observances
- College visits
- Approved school-supervised trips
- Required presence in court

PARENTS:

Please contact the appropriate attendance personnel if your child will be absent or late to school.

Absence or tardiness for any other reason is considered illegal and will be entered on the student's permanent record. Each student who has been absent must bring a written excuse (including student's first and last name, date of absence, reason for absence, and parent/guardian's signature) on the day of his/her return to school.

HEALTH SERVICES:

Health services are provided for all students consistent with state and federal law. The school's nurse is responsible for the school's health program. A health record is maintained on each student that includes a medical history and information on height, weight, vision, hearing, color perception, and scoliosis screenings performed throughout the child's elementary, middle, and high school years. Parents are notified if a child fails to pass any screening test, and recommendations are made for further medical evaluations. Special health problems are followed as needed.

If you have any questions regarding a health problem with your child, please contact the nurse in your child's school. It is important to keep the nurse informed of any changes in your child's health status (surgeries, injuries/fractures, changes in medications, immunizations, allergies, etc.) to assist in continuity of care.

Please keep a current phone number in your child's health office where you can be reached in the event of an emergency.

SCHOOL MEDICATION POLICY:

If you wish to have your child receive medication during school hours, the following policy according to the NYS Education Law must be followed:

- Medication (prescriptions or over-the-counter) can be given in school ONLY with a written doctor's order.
 This order must include the student's full name, name of medication, dosage, time, and dates to be given.
 The label on the medication bottle is NOT suggestive.
- Medication MUST be in its original container and be accompanied by the doctor's order and parent's signature before it will be given at school. Medicine arriving to school in unmarked containers, baggies, etc. cannot be given.
- All the medication is to be kept in the school health office throughout the time it is to be administered. Medication must be delivered to the school by a responsible adult.
- Students are NOT permitted to carry any medications with them or store them in a locker or classroom.

Completion of the appropriate form*, including a doctor and parent/guardian's signature, will fulfill the above requirements and ensure that your child will be able to receive the stated medication at school once it has been delivered by an adult. School nurses cannot administer ANY medication without a physician's order and written permission from a parent. This includes: Tylenol, Advil, allergy and cold medications, cough drops, etc. Please contact the school nurse in your child's building if you have any questions or concerns.

*Copies of the Authorization for Administration of Medication forms are available in school health offices and on the Nurse's Office page on your child's school website.

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PHYSICALS:

NYS mandates that all students in Grades K, 2, 4, 7, and 10, as well as all new entrants into the district receive a physical examination. Students involved in sports are also required to have physicals within the previous 12 months. If a student has a sports physical during the year in which a specific grade level physical is required, the sports physical will be sufficient for both requirements. Our school physician does offer school physicals for the grades listed above and for sports at no charge to parents. However, it is recommended that your child receives a physical by their own primary care physician, as he/she knows your child best.

MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE:

All students entering Grades 7 and 12 must have the meningococcal vaccine. Without it, they cannot start school.

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DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY:

A student apprehended or guilty of possession, use, being under the influence of, or buying or selling drugs or alcohol on school grounds (including parked cars), on school buses, and at school-sponsored events will be subject to school disciplinary action.

Offense - Parents/guardians notified, five day out-of-school suspension, recommended CHAD referral, and Superintendent's Hearing.

Random drug searches will be conducted by county and state drug dog officials throughout the school year. All incidents will be reported to the NYS Police or Cayuga County Sheriff's Department.

More information is detailed in the athletic and extra-curricular Code of Conduct in the Union Springs Middle and High School handbooks.

DRUG-FREE SCHOOL ZONES:

In addition to school penalties for involvement with drugs or alcohol, all schools in the Union Springs Central School District have legally been declared Drug-Free School Zones. This includes the real property boundary of all schools together with 1000 feet beyond these boundaries. Increased criminal penalties for actual or threatened sale of controlled substances within these zones are mandated by law (New York State Law Chapter 280 Section 220.44 of the laws of 1986).

SCHOOL BUDGET VOTE:

Each year the Board of Education must go to the registered district voters to seek approval of the school budget. Preparing the budget is a year-long process. The board makes every effort to explore all possible sources of income and to guide the expenditure of funds so as to achieve the greatest educational returns for our children. The board greatly appreciates the interest, which is evident by good voter turnout in our school district.

The responsibility to vote is an important one as Thomas Jefferson, John Quincy Adams, and Rutherford B. Hayes were all elected to office by one vote each. California, Washington, Idaho, Texas, and Oregon gained statehood by one vote each. Our own budget vote ended in a 500/500 tie in 1997.

COMMUNITY USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES:

Community groups are encouraged to use our school facilities. Groups wishing to do so must secure written permission from the building principal, or for gym space, the Athletic Coordinator. School functions take precedence over all activities by non-school groups.

School facilities may be used between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. except during the hours when school is in session. This includes the outdoor basketball courts and playgrounds. Please note that skateboarding is NOT allowed on school grounds at any time.

A "carry in, carry out" policy requires that individuals and groups remove all trash from school premises when leaving. Only leashed dogs are permitted on school property, and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.

SCHOOL INSURANCE:

The school district carries a blanket insurance package that provides only secondary insurance coverage for students. Your own family insurance must provide the primary coverage. The district policy thus provides limited coverage of expenses not covered by the family's medical insurance. The district does not self-insure or pick up costs not covered by the insurance plans.


GUN-FREE SCHOOL ZONE:

BOARD OF EDUCATION:

An appeal to the Board of Education may be sought on any issue after all the appropriate steps have been exhausted. It is the primary responsibility of the Board to set policy for the school district. The superintendent and administrative staff are legally empowered to administer the school district and put into operation the policies of the Board of Education.

COUNSELOR SERVICES:

Counselor services are an indispensable part of the educational process, helping students participate effectively in school. Counselors help students achieve academically by providing guidance in personal, emotional, social, and behavioral areas. As a resource person to students, staff, and parents, the school counselor assists in making wise choices in light of current situations as well as in developing post-high school plans. Students and parents are encouraged to consult with their school counselor during the school year when the need arises. Conferences may be set up with counselors and/or teachers by contacting the individual school.

COMPACT FOR LEARNING SHARED DECISION MAKING:

In accordance with the Plan for Participation developed by the USCS District Planning Team, Site-Based Teams (SBT) and a District-Based Team (DBT) meet on a regular basis. All decisions are made by consensus, and all meetings are open to the public. For information regarding the meeting times and locations of the various teams, please contact Mike Wurster at (315) 889-4112.

There is a Site-Based Team for each of our educational sites: A.J. Smith Elementary School, Union Springs Middle School, and Union Springs High School. Each is composed of the principal at the site, 3-4 school staff members, and 2-4 parents/community members. Three students serve on the Middle School Site-Based Team and four students serve on the High School Site-Based Team. The Site-Based Teams deal with issues related to their particular sites.

The District-Based Team is composed of the Superintendent, the Special Education Administrator, a building principal, two teachers-at-large, three parents-at-large, two community members, two support staff, one high school student, and a representative from each of the Site-Based Teams. The District-Based Team works to promote and facilitate shared decision making within the district.

AGE REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDING SCHOOL:

Children who turn five on or before December 1 are eligible to attend school beginning the preceding September.

Children who turn six on or before December 1 MUST attend school from the start of classes in September of that school year. Children who turn six years of age after December 1 MUST attend school the following September.

Children who turn 17 during the school year MUST remain in school until the end of that school year.

UPDATING RECORDS:

Maintaining communication between significant family members and school staff can be an important basis for student success. Family relationships are occasionally changed due to adoption, divorce, sickness, death, etc. School offices must be provided with legal documents (current custody arrangements, orders of protection, etc.) in order to honor requests for limitations on communications with family members.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Students transferring from other school districts are asked to provide copies of academic and health records from the school last attended. Students transferring in must have immunizations for Diphtheria, Pertussis, Polio, Mumps, Regular and German Measles (Rubella), Hepatitis B, and Chicken Pox.
