SAFETY CONDITIONS AND PROGRAMS

Every possible precaution will be taken to protect the safety of all students, SUBJECT: employees, visitors and others present on District property or at school-sponsored events.

The practice of safety will also be considered an integral part of the instructional program through fire prevention, emergency procedures and drills, driver education, and traffic and pedestrian safety.

Each principal will be responsible for the supervision of a safety program for his/her school.

General areas of emphasis in the safety program will include, but not be limited to, in-service training, plant inspection, fire prevention, accident recordkeeping, driver and vehicle safety programs, emergency procedures and drills, and traffic safety problems relevant to students, employees and the community.

An annual inspection shall be made by the Safety Coordinator and the school administrator to determine any unsafe or unsanitary conditions within the schools.

Eye safety devices are to be provided by the School District for the protection of employees, students and visitors. Such devices shall be worn in the technology education and physical education classes, labs and athletic events when activities present a potential eye hazard. The Superintendent or his/her designee will be responsible for these devices being properly repaired, cleaned and stored to prevent the spread of germs or diseases after individuals use them.
